1.1 Safety definitions

NOTICE:

This indicates that damage to the appliance or property may occur as a result of non-compliance with this advisory.

Note: This alerts you to important information and/or tips.

1.2 General information



- Read this manual carefully.
- Keep the manual and the product information in a safe place for future reference or for the next owner.
- Do not connect the appliance if it has been damaged in transit.

1.3 Intended use

Only a licensed professional may connect appliances without plugs. The manufacturer is not responsible for damage caused by incorrect connections. An incorrect connection is not covered by the Statement of Limited Product Warranty.

Only use this appliance:

- For washing machine-washable fabrics and handwashable wool in accordance with the care label.
- With tap water and commercially available, washingmachine-suitable detergents and care products.
- for normal household use and in enclosed spaces in a residential environment.
- Up to an altitude of 13,100 ft (4000 m) above sea level.

1.4 Restrictive Use

This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge,

unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.

Do not let children play with the appliance.

Cleaning and user maintenance must not be performed by children unless they are being supervised.

Keep children under the age of 3 and pets away from the appliance.

1.5 Grounding instructions

This appliance must be grounded. In the event of malfunction or breakdown, grounding will reduce the risk of electric shock by providing a path of least resistance for electric current. This appliance is equipped with a cord having an equipment-grounding conductor. Installation, electrical connections and grounding must comply with all applicable codes.

WARNING

Improper connection of the equipment-grounding conductor can result in a risk of electric shock.

► Check with a qualified electrician or authorized service representative if you are in doubt whether the appliance is properly grounded.



1.6 Safe installation

WARNING

To avoid risk of injury from incorrect installations, observe the following.

- Ensure all installation instructions are followed before use.
- Connect and operate the appliance only in accordance with the specifications on the rating plate.
- Connect the appliance to a power supply with alternating current only via a correctly installed socket outlet with grounding.
- The protective conductor system of the domestic electrical installation must be properly installed. The installation must have a sufficiently large cable crosssection.
- ► When using a residual current circuit breaker, only use a type with the mark.
- ► Never equip the appliance with an external switching device, e.g. a timer or remote control.
- When the appliance is installed, the mains plug of the power cord must be freely accessible. If free access is not possible, an isolating switch must be integrated into the permanent electrical installation according to the installation regulations.
- When installing the appliance, check that the power cord is not trapped or damaged.

To avoid risk of injury from damaged insulation of the power cord, observe the following.

- Never let the power cord come into contact with hot appliance parts or heat sources.
- Never let the power cord come into contact with sharp points or edges.
- ▶ Never kink, crush or modify the power cord.

WARNING

To avoid risk of injury from an extended power cord and non-approved adapters, observe the following.

- ▶ Do not use extension cords or multiple socket strips.
- Only use adapters and power cords approved by the manufacturer.
- ► If the power cord is too short and a longer one is not available, please contact an electrician to have the domestic installation adapted.

WARNING

The heavy weight of the appliance may result in injury when lifted.

Do not lift the appliance on your own.

If this appliance is not correctly installed in a washer-dryer stack, the installed appliance may fall.

- Only stack the dryer on a washing machine using the connection kit from the dryer manufacturer. No other installation method is permitted.
- Do not install the appliance in a washer-dryer stack if the dryer manufacturer does not offer a suitable connection kit.
- Do not install appliances from different manufacturers and with varying depths and widths in a washer-dryer stack.
- Do not install a washer-dryer stack on a platform; the appliances may tip over.

WARNING

Children may pull packaging material over their heads, or wrap themselves up in it and suffocate.

CAUTION

1.7 Safe use

WARNING

To avoid risk of injury from a damaged appliance or power cord, observe the following.

- ▶ Never operate a damaged appliance.
- ► Never pull on the power cord to unplug the appliance.

 Always unplug the appliance at the power outlet.
- If the appliance or the power cord is damaged, immediately unplug the power cord or switch off the breaker in the circuit breaker box and turn off the water tap.

Moisture intrusion may cause an electric shock.

- ▶ Use the appliance in enclosed spaces only.
- Never expose the appliance to intense heat or humidity.
- ► Do not use steam cleaners, high-pressure cleaners, hoses or sprays to clean the appliance.

WARNING

Children can lock themselves in the appliance, thereby putting their lives at risk.

- The appliance must not be set up behind a lockable door, a sliding door or a door with a hinge on the side opposite to the appliance, which prevents appliance from opening fully.
- With redundant appliances, pull out the mains plug of the power cord, cut through the power cord and remove the appliance door.

When spinning larger, waterproof items of laundry, imbalances may arise and lead to injuries.

▶ Do not wash and spin larger items of laundry, such as blankets or mattress covers, in the appliance.

WARNING

Children may breathe in or swallow small parts, causing them to suffocate.

- Do not allow children to play with small parts.

WARNING

A hot-water system that has not been used for 2 weeks or more may produce flammable hydrogen gas.

Detergents and care products may result in poisoning if consumed.

Laundry that has been pretreated with flammable cleaning agents that contain solvents may cause an explosion in the appliance.

Rinse pretreated laundry thoroughly with water before washing.

CAUTION

The covering plate may break if you stand on or climb onto the appliance.

Do not stand on or climb onto the appliance.

The appliance may tip over if you sit on or lean against the open door.

- ▶ Do not sit on or lean against the appliance door.
- ► Do not place any objects on the appliance door. Reaching into the drum while it is still turning may cause hand injuries.
- ► Wait for the drum to come to a complete stop before reaching inside.

When you wash at high temperatures, the detergent solution becomes hot.

Do not touch the hot detergent solution.

CAUTION

If the detergent drawer is opened, detergent and care products may spray out from the appliance. Contact with eyes or skin may cause irritation.

- Rinse eyes and/or skin thoroughly with clean water if they come into contact with detergents or care products.
- ► If accidentally swallowed, seek medical advice.
- Keep detergents and care products out of the reach of children.

1.8 Safe cleaning and maintenance

WARNING

To avoid risk of injury from improper repairs, observe the following.

Never make any technical modifications to the appliance or its features.



- Do not tamper with controls.
- Only qualified technicians or authorized service providers should perform repairs.
- Only genuine spare parts may be used to repair the appliance.
- If the power cord of this appliance becomes damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, the manufacturer's Customer Service, or an authorized service provider in order to prevent injury.

Moisture intrusion may cause an electric shock.

- Before cleaning, pull out the power plug or switch off the circuit breaker in the circuit breaker box.
- Do not use steam cleaners, high-pressure cleaners, hoses or sprays to clean the appliance.

2 Preventing material damage

NOTICE:

The functionality of the appliance may be impaired if you use the wrong quantity of fabric softener, detergent, care product or cleaning agent.

- Follow the dosage recommendations from the manufacturer.
- Only use fabric softeners or products to eliminate static that are specifically recommended for this purpose by the product manufacturer.

Exceeding the maximum load capacity impairs the function of the appliance.

Observe the maximum load capacity for each programme and do not exceed it. → Page 22

The appliance is secured for transportation using transport locks. Transit bolts which have not been removed may result in material damage and damage to the appliance.

- ▶ Before starting up the appliance, remove the transit bolts completely and keep them in a safe place.
- Before transport, fit the transit bolts fully in order to prevent damage in transit.

Material damage may be caused if the water inlet hose is connected incorrectly.

- ► Tighten the screw connections on the water inlet until they are hand-tight.
- Connect the water inlet hose directly to the water tap, without any additional connecting elements such as adapters, extensions, or valves.
- Make sure that the valve housing for the water inlet hose does not come into contact with its surroundings and is not subjected to any external forces.
- ► Ensure that the inner diameter of the water tap is at least 17 mm.
- ► Make sure that the length of the thread on the connection to the water tap is at least 10 mm.

To avoid damage to the appliance or property damage, observe the following.

▶ Do not connect the appliance to the water line during construction or if the water appears cloudy or contains visible particles. Failure to follow these instructions may result in foreign materials entering the appliance, which could impair its performance, or cause water leakage.

If the water pressure is too high or too low, this may impair functioning of the appliance.

- ► Make sure that the water pressure in the water supply system is at least 14.5 psi (100 kPa) and max. 145 psi (1000 kPa).
- If the water pressure exceeds the maximum value specified, a pressure-reducing valve must be installed between the drinking water connection and the hose set of the appliance.
- ► Do not connect the appliance to the mixer tap of an unpressurised hot-water boiler.

Modified or damaged water hoses may result in material damage and damage to the appliance.

- ► Never kink, crush, modify or cut through water hoses.
- Only use the water hoses supplied with the appliance or genuine spare hoses.

- ▶ Never re-use water hoses that have been used before. Operating the appliance using water that is dirty or too hot may lead to material damage and damage to the appliance.
- ► Only operate the appliance with cold or warm (max. 60 °C/140 °F) mains water.

Unsuitable cleaning agents may damage the surfaces of the appliance.

- ▶ Do not use strong or abrasive cleaning agents.
- ▶ Do not use cleaning agents with a high alcohol content.
- ► Do not use hard scouring pads or cleaning sponges.
- ► Clean the appliance with nothing but water and a soft, damp cloth.
- Remove all detergent residue, spray residue or other residues immediately if they come into contact with the appliance.

3 Environmental protection and energy-saving

3.1 Disposal of packaging

The packaging materials are environmentally compatible and can be recycled.

 Sort the individual components by type and dispose of them separately.

3.2 Save energy and conserve resources

If you follow these instructions, your appliance will use less power and water.

- Choose programs with low temperatures and longer wash times and use maximum load capacity.
 - → Page 22
- Reduce the washing temperature for lightly and normally soiled laundry.
- Set the maximum spin speed if you want to dry the laundry in a tumble dryer afterwards.
- Wash the laundry without prewash.

3.3 Energy-saving mode

If you do not use the appliance for a brief period, it automatically switches to energy-saving mode. All displays go out and II \triangleright flashes.

Energy-saving mode ends when you use the appliance again.

If you do not use the appliance for an extended period, it automatically switches to standby mode.

4 Installation and connection

Install the appliance according to the manufacturer's instructions and local codes.

4.1 Unpacking the appliance

NOTICE:

Objects remaining in the drum that are not designed for operation with the appliance may cause material damage and damage to the appliance.

- Remove these objects, along with all supplied accessories, from the drum before starting the appliance.
- 1. Remove any packaging and protective covers completely from the appliance.
 - → "Disposal of packaging", Page 8
- 2. Check the appliance for visible damage.
- 3. Open the door. → Page 26
- 4. Remove any accessories from the drum.
- 5. Close the door.

4.2 Included in delivery

After unpacking all the parts, check for any damage in transit and for completeness of delivery.

NOTICE:

If the appliance is operated with incomplete or defective accessories, the appliance may not be able to operate properly, or this may result in material damage and damage to the appliance.

- ► Do not operate the appliance with incomplete or defective accessories.
- ► Replace the accessories in question before operating the appliance.
 - → "Accessories", Page 25

Note: The appliance has undergone a function test at the factory. This may cause water stains in the appliance, which the first wash cycle removes.

The delivery consists of the following:

- Washing machine
- Accompanying documents
- Transit bolts → Page 11
- Cover cap¹
- Water inlet hoses → Page 12
- Elbow for securing the water outlet hose

4.3 Requirements for the installation location

WARNING

The appliance contains live parts. Touching live parts is dangerous.

Do not operate the appliance without a cover cap.

WARNING

When using the appliance on a base, the appliance may tip over.

Always secure the feet of the appliance to a base using the manufacturer's fixing brackets → Page 25 before using the appliance for the first time.

If residual water in the appliance freezes, this may cause damage to the appliance.


► Do not install or operate this appliance anywhere that is liable to experience frost and/or outdoors.

If the appliance is tilted at an angle greater than 40°, residual water may leak out of the appliance and cause material damage.

- ► Tilt the appliance carefully.
- ► Transport the appliance in an upright position.


Place the appliance on a water-resistant wooden board (minimum thickness of 1.18 in. (30 mm)) which is screwed tightly to the floor.



Only install the appliance underneath a continuous countertop that is securely connected to adjacent cabinets. Required niche width: 23.6 in. (60 cm).

Do not trap the power cord or the hoses between the wall and the appliance.

The number of cover caps varies depending on the model.

4.4 Installation types

The appliance can be set up in a closed cabinet either in a washer-dryer stack or free-standing.

WARNING

If this appliance is not correctly installed in a washer-dryer stack, the installed appliance may fall.

- ► Only stack the dryer on a washing machine using the connection kit from the dryer manufacturer . No other installation method is permitted.
- ► Do not install the appliance in a washer-dryer stack if the dryer manufacturer does not offer a suitable connection kit.
- ► Do not install appliances from different manufacturers and with varying depths and widths in a washer-dryer stack.
- Do not install a washer-dryer stack on a platform; the appliances may tip over.


Installation in a closed cabinet

Notes

- In case of set up in a washer-dryer stack, please observe the requirements for the installation location.
- When installing in a cabinet, comply with the required minimum dimensions.
- To achieve shorter drying times, operate the appliance with the cabinet door open.

Operating the appliance in a closed cabinet with only the minimum required ventilation openings may lead to longer drying times.

The specified dimensions of the ventilation opening apply to each position and must not be divided between the upper and lower positions.





4.5 Removing the transit bolts


The appliance is secured for transportation using transit bolts on the rear of the appliance.

Note: Keep the transit bolt screws and the sleeves in a safe place for future transport.


1. Remove the hose ① and the power cord ② from the holders.



2. Unscrew 1) and remove 2) all of the screws for the 4 transit bolts using a 13 mm wrench.




3. Remove the 4 sleeves.




4. Insert the cover cap and push it downwards.

Notes

- Note the number of cover caps included in the scope of delivery
- If four cover caps are included in the scope of delivery, insert the cover caps in the four openings for the transit bolts.



If one cover cap is included in the scope of delivery, insert the cover cap in the bottom left opening for the transit bolt.



Note: To install the transport locks to transport the appliance, perform these steps again in the reverse order.


4.6 Connecting the appliance

Connecting the water inlet hoses


NOTICE:

Material damage may be caused if the water inlet hose is connected incorrectly.

- ► Tighten the screw connections on the water inlet until they are hand-tight.
- 1. Connect the water inlet hose for hot water (red) and cold water (b) (blue) to the appliance.



2. Connect the water inlet hose for hot water (red) and cold water (b) (blue) to the faucet (26.4 mm = 3/4").



If there is no faucet for hot water, only connect the water inlet hose for cold water. Cover the hot water connection on the appliance in order to protect it from dirt.

Tip: To protect against dirt, use a 3/4" end cap on the hot water connection of the appliance.

3. Open the faucets carefully and check that the connection points are tight.

Water outlet connection types

This information is intended to help you to connect this appliance to the water outlet.

NOTICE:

When draining, the water drain hose is subject to water pressure and may come loose from the installed connection point.


Secure the water drain hose against unintentional loosening.

In the event of a blocked or covered outlet, accumulated wastewater can flow back into the appliance.

Before operating the appliance, ensure that the wastewater drains away quickly and eliminate any blockages.

Note: Observe the draining heights. The maximum draining height is 39 in. (100 cm).




Secure the connection point with a (0.94–1.57 in. (24–40 mm)) hose clamp.





Connecting the appliance to the electricity supply


Note: Your electrical domestic installation for this appliance must comply with the local legal provisions and safety regulations, and should include a residual current circuit breaker.

- 1. Insert the power adapter with the line side into a suitable socket close to the appliance.
 - Observe the user manual that is enclosed with the power adapter.
- 2. Insert the power plug of the appliance's power cord in a socket outlet with grounding nearby.
 - The connection details of the appliance can be found under Technical data → Page 41.
- 3. Check the power plug is inserted properly.


4.7 Aligning the appliance

In order to reduce noise and vibrations, and to prevent the appliance from moving, align the appliance correctly.

1. Use a 17 mm wrench to loosen the lock nuts in a clockwise direction.




2. To align the appliance, turn the appliance feet. Check that the appliance is level using a spirit level.



All appliance feet must stand firmly on the ground.

3. Use a 17 mm wrench to tighten the lock nuts against the housing until they are hand-tight.



In doing so, hold the appliance foot tight and do not adjust its height.

5 Before using for the first time


Prepare the appliance for use.

5.1 Starting an empty washing cycle


Your appliance was inspected thoroughly before leaving the factory. To remove any residual water, run the first wash cycle without any laundry.

- 1. Press \odot .
 - The switch-on process takes a few seconds.
- 2. Select the 90° programme or a programme for drum cleaning. → Page 30
- 3. Close the door.
- 4. Pull out the detergent drawer.

5. Pour approximately 4.3 cups (1 liter) of mains water into the manual dosing compartment.



6. Add washing powder containing oxygen bleach to the manual dosing compartment.




To prevent foaming, use only half of the amount of detergent recommended by the detergent manufacturer for light soiling. Do not use detergent suitable for woolens or delicates.

- 7. Push in the detergent drawer.
- 8. Start the program. → Page 26
- 9. Start the first wash cycle or press $^{(\!\!\!)}$ to put the appliance in standby mode.








Displaying or hiding additional buttons

2. To hide the additional buttons, briefly press More again.

Changing a setting value

If you activate certain settings, the display shows selection buttons and you can change the setting value.





11 Laundry

11.1 Preparing the laundry

NOTICE:

Objects remaining in the laundry may damage the laundry and the drum.

Remove all items from any pockets in your laundry before using the appliance.

Note

The appliance and fabrics are protected when you prepare your laundry.

- Brush off sand and soil
- Sort the laundry according to color and fabrics and observe the care labels
- Close all zippers, hook and loop fasteners, hooks and eyes
- Tie cloth belts, cloth straps and cords together
- Remove curtain fittings and lead strips
- Wash small or particularly delicate items in a mesh washing bag
- Wash large and small items of laundry together
- Wash laundry with fresh stains immediately
- Pretreat laundry with dried stains and wash several times
- Load the laundry unfolded into the drum
- Before loading the drum, any laundry that has been pretreated with chlorine bleach should be rinsed several times

12 Detergents and care products

You can protect your appliance and your laundry by selecting and using the correct detergents and care products.

The manufacturer's instructions for use and dosage can be found on the packaging.

Notes

- when using liquid detergents, only use liquid detergents that are self-flowing
- Do not mix different liquid detergents
- Do not mix detergent and fabric softener
- Do not use products that have expired or are highly congealed
- do not use products containing solvents, caustic agents or volatile substances
- Do not use chlorine bleach
- Do not use dyes regularly as fixing salt can damage stainless steel
- Do not use color-bleaching agents in the appliance
- Do not pour vinegar into the dispensers → Page 27 of the intelligent dosing system

13 Basic Operation

13.1 Switching on the appliance

Note: If you switch the appliance on the first time after you have connected it to the electrical system, the switch-on process takes up to one minute.

Requirement: The appliance has been correctly installed and connected. \rightarrow *Page 9*

▶ Press Ů.



An audible function test is carried out.

Note: The lighting for the drum goes out automatically.

13.2 Setting a program

The program settings are not saved permanently for the program.

Note: The setting is saved if you activate or deactivate the intelligent dosing system.

- The Home Connect® app displays the programs that can be selected.





- 2. Place the laundry in the drum.
- 3. Close the door.

Ensure that there is no laundry trapped in the door.

13.6 Starting the program

Note: If you use the intelligent dosing system, ensure that you fill the dispensers, set the basic dosage, and push the detergent drawer all the way in. → *Page 27*

Requirements

- A program has been set. → Page 25
- The door is closed.
- Press II D.

- The drum rotates and load detection takes place. This can take up to 2 minutes, after which water enters the drum
- The display shows the program duration or the program end time.
- After the program has ended, the display shows: End.

13.7 Soaking laundry

Note: No additional detergent is required for soaking. The appliance uses the filled detergent for soaking and washing.

Requirements

- The laundry is placed in the appliance. → Page 26
- A program has started. → Page 26
- Press II ▷ approx. 10 minutes after the program start.
 The program pauses and the laundry can soak.
- 2. Press II > after the required soaking time.

13.8 Adding laundry

After the program starts, you can remove or add laundry depending on the program status.

1. Press II D.

The appliance pauses.

Note: If you want to add laundry, follow the instructions on the display. → *Page 18*

- 2. Open the door. → Page 26
- 3. Add or remove laundry.
- 4. Close the door.
- 5. Start the program. → Page 26

13.9 Terminating the program

- 1. Press II D.
- 2. Open the door. → *Page 26*

The appliance door remains locked for safety reasons if the temperature and water levels are high.

- If the temperature is high, start the **Rinse** program.
- If the water level is high, start the **Spin** program or select a suitable program for draining. → Page 22
- 3. Remove the laundry. → Page 27

13.10 Removing the laundry

- 1. Open the door. → Page 26
- 2. Remove the laundry from the drum.

13.11 Put the appliance into standby mode

- 1. Press \odot .
- 2. Turn off the tap.
- 3. Cleaning the rubber gasket. → Page 35

Note: Leave the appliance door and the detergent drawer open to dry.

14 Control panel lock

Secure your appliance against being operated unintentionally using the controls.

14.1 Activating the control panel lock

- ▶ Press and hold c 3 sec. for around 3 seconds.
- ▼ The control elements are locked.
- The control panel lock also remains activated when the appliance is in standby mode and in the event of a power failure.

14.2 Deactivating the control panel lock

Requirement: To deactivate the control panel lock, the appliance must be switched on.

- ▶ Press and hold 3 sec. for around 3 seconds.

15 Intelligent dosing system

The appliance's intelligent dosing system is activated at the factory and automatically doses liquid detergent and fabric softener for any programs in which intelligent dosing is possible.

Note: You can use the buttons \rightarrow *Page 20* to deactivate the intelligent dosing system, e.g. in order to manually dose washing powder \rightarrow *Page 28*.


15.1 Pouring liquid detergent and fabric softener into the dispensers

If you are using the intelligent dosing system or if the appliance displays a notification during operation of the appliance, fill the dispensers.

Notes

- Only pour suitable liquid detergent and fabric softener into the dispensers. → Page 25
- If you add more liquid detergent or fabric softener to the dispenser, use the same product.
- If you want to replace the liquid detergent or fabric softener in the dispenser with another product, clean the detergent drawer beforehand → Page 30.
- If you are using the intelligent dosing system, do not add additional detergent or fabric softener into the compartment for manual dosing. This is to prevent overdosing or foam formation.
- 1. Pull out the detergent drawer.

2. Open the lid and pour liquid detergent ♦ and fabric softener ♦ into the relevant dispensers → Page 15.



Do not exceed the marking for the maximum fill level when filling.

Note: You can also use both dispensers for liquid detergent. Adapt the dispenser for this. → *Page 28*

Close the lid.

Note: To prevent the liquid detergent or fabric softener from drying out, close the lids immediately after filling.

4. Push in the detergent drawer.

15.2 Using the manual dosing compartment

If you are not using the intelligent dosing system, if intelligent dosing is not possible for a program, or if you want to add additional care product, e.g. stain remover or starch, use the manual dosing compartment.

Note: Observe the information about detergents and care products \rightarrow *Page 25*.

- 1. Pull out the detergent drawer.
- Pour laundry detergent or care product into the manual dosing compartment → Page 15.
- 3. Push in the detergent drawer.

15.3 Adapting the ⊗/∆ dispenser

The \Re/O dispenser can dose fabric softener \Re or liquid detergent O. When it leaves the factory, the dispenser is set for fabric softener. If you want to automatically dose a second liquid detergent, adapt the dispenser.

Notes

- If you adapt the contents of the dispenser, the basic dosage for this dispenser is reset.
- If you use both dispensers for liquid detergent, you must set a dispenser which is to be used during washing.
 → Page 20
- 1. Press and hold **i-DOS 2** for approximately 3 seconds.
- 2. Press i-DOS 2 repeatedly until the display shows O (liquid detergent) or ⊕ (fabric softener).
- 3. Wait briefly to save the setting.

15.4 Setting the basic dosage amount

To allow for intelligent dosing, set the basic dosage amount for the dispenser. The basic dosage amount corresponds to the dosage recommendation from the detergent manufacturer on the packaging. Set the basic dosage amount that corresponds to the dosage recommendation for 11 lbs (5 kg) of normally soiled laundry.

Tip: You can also set the basic dosage amount in the Home Connect® app.

- 1. Press and hold **i-DOS 1** for approximately 3 seconds.
- The display shows the set basic dosage amount.
- To adjust the setting, press
- 3. Wait briefly to save the setting.

Note: To set the basic dosage amount for the other dispenser, repeat the steps with **i-DOS 2**.

16 Home Connect®

This appliance is network-capable. Connecting your appliance to a mobile device lets you control its functions via the Home Connect® app, adjust its basic settings and monitor its operating status.





Clean the drum if you have carried out 20 washing cycles at a temperature of Hot or lower, if @ flashes, or if you have not used the appliance for a prolonged period, but at least once a year.

Permanently washing at low temperatures and a lack of ventilation for the appliance may damage the drum and cause injury.

- Regularly run a program for cleaning the drum or wash at temperatures of Extra Hot.
- ► Leave the appliance to dry after every operation with the door open, and leave the detergent drawer to dry.
- ► Run the **Drum Clean** program without laundry but with washing powder that contains oxygen bleach or a cleaning agent for caring for the inside of the appliance.

18.2 Cleaning the detergent drawer

If you want to replace the liquid detergent or fabric softener in the dispenser with another product or if the detergent drawer is dirty, clean the detergent dispenser.

The pump unit contains electrical components. Electrical components may be damaged if they come into contact


