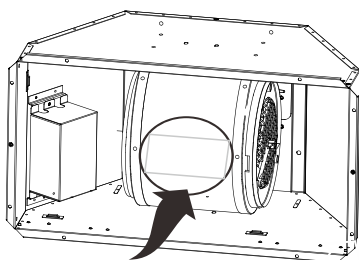

The range hood must be connected with copper wire only.

The range hood should be connected directly to the fused disconnect (Or circuit breaker) box through metal electrical conduit.

Wire sizes must conform to the requirements of the National Electrical Code ANSI/NFPA 70 — latest edition*, or CSA Standards C22.1-94, Canadian Electrical Code Part 1 and C22.2 No. 0-M91 - latest edition** and all local codes and ordinances.

A U.L.- or C.S.A.-listed conduit connector must be provided at each end of the power supply conduit (at the range hood and at the junction box).

Before installing the hood

1. For the most efficient air flow exhaust, use a straight run or as few elbows as possible.

**CAUTION**

Vent unit to outside of building and recirculating.

2. At least two people are necessary for installation.
3. The hood is fitted with Screws and Drywall Anchors suitable for most surfaces, consult a Qualified Installer, check if they perfectly fit with your cabinet/wall.
4. Do not use flex ducting.
5. COLD WEATHER installations should have an additional backdraft damper that is already installed to minimize backward cold air flow and a nonmetallic thermal break to minimize conduction of outside temperatures as part of the ductwork. The damper should be on the cold air side of the thermal break. The break should be as close as possible to where the ducting enters the heated portion of the house.
6. Make up air: Local building codes may require the use of Make-Up Air Systems when using Ducted Ventilation Systems greater than specified CFM of air movement. The specified CFM varies from locale to locale. Consult your HVAC professional for specific requirements in your area.

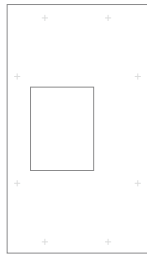

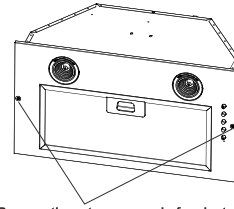
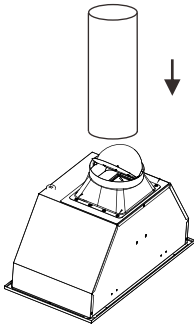


1.Duct Installation

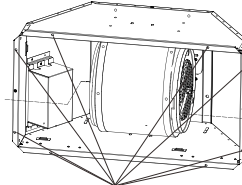
Use an outlet exhaust duct with:

- Minimum indispensable length;
- Minimum possible bends(maximum angle of bend: 90°)
- Certified material(according to the state).

It is also advisable to avoid any drastic changes in duct cross-section
(recommended diameter:
155mm/6 inch)

The 8 mounting holes.

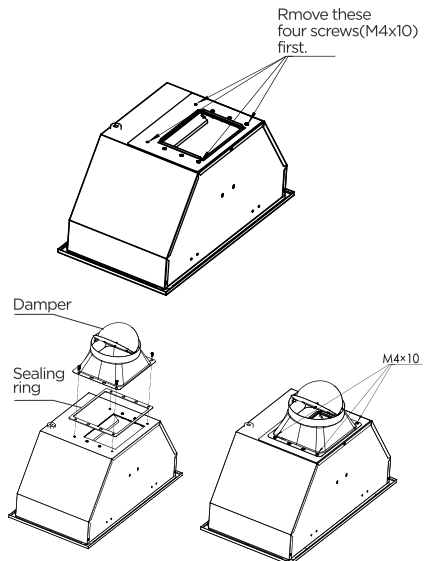
2.Mounting the hood

2.1 Prior to installing range hood, cut a $\varnothing 165\text{mm}$ / 6.5 inch hole for the exhaust duct to exit the installation location.

2.2 Prior to installing range hood, confirm the location of the power outlet to determine if any additional holes are needed for proper routing of power cord.

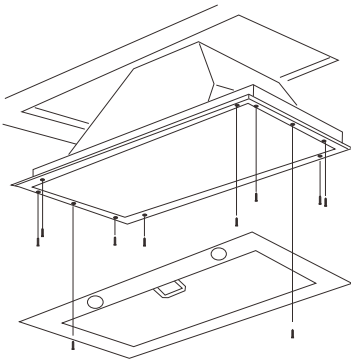
2.3 Prior to installing range hood, remove the face by removing the two screws on the left and right sides and disconnect the power connections at the two visible connectors. Then, remove the damper stored inside the range hood for shipping. Locate the included hardware kit also stored inside the range hood for shipping.

2.4 Prior to installing range hood, to remove these four screws(M4×10) shown on below picture first. Then to assemble the damper and sealing ring to the rear of the hood as shown using the four screws (M4×10) removed from the hood body.



10 Installation

- 2.5 Using the included mounting template, drill 8 mounting holes (1mm/#60 size drill bit) in the installation location. Install range hood into installation location and secure with 8 screws (ST3.5×25) supplied in the installation hardware kit. Reconnect the power connections and reinstall the face of the unit.



- 2.6 Make the electrical connection.

Notice:

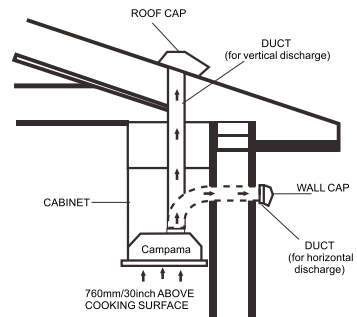
- Exhaust air must not be discharged into a flue that is used for exhausting fumes from an appliance burning gas or other fuels.
- For installation over a gas cooking appliance, refer to the gas appliance Installation instructions or minimum recommended mounting distance.
- The exhaust duct should be metal and solid.

3.Connections Ducted Mode



CAUTION

To reduce the risk of fire, metal ductwork is preferred. (Metal duct should be sourced locally.)



- 3.1 Decide where the ductwork will run between the hood and the outside.
- 3.2 A straight, short duct run will allow the hood to perform most efficiently.
- 3.3 Long duct runs, elbows, and transitions will reduce the performance of the hood. Use as few of them as possible. Larger ducting may be required for best performance with longer duct runs.
- 3.4 It is recommended that $\varnothing$ 155mm / 6 inch solid round duct is to be used.
- 3.5 Install a roof/wall cap. Connect round duct work to cap and work back towards hood location. Use duct tape to seal the joints between duct work sections.

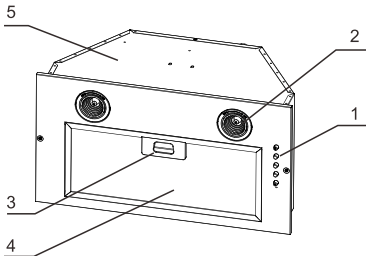
Electrical Connection

WARNING

- Electrical wiring must be done by a qualified person(s) in accordance with all applicable codes and standards. Turn off electrical power at service entrance before wiring.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

- The ground connection of this hood is compulsory. Do not remove ground prong of the plug.

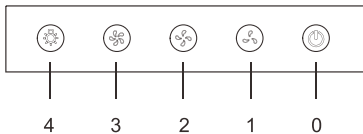

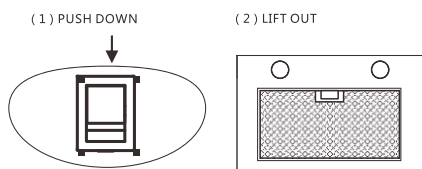

Grease Filter

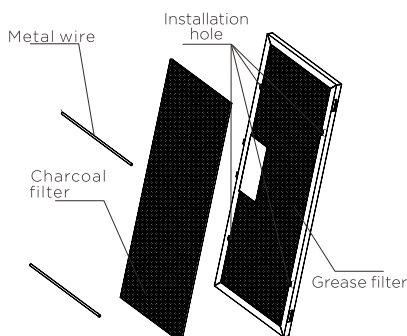
- The grease filter should be cleaned frequently (every two months of operation, or more frequently for heavy use.)
- Grease filter is dishwasher safe.



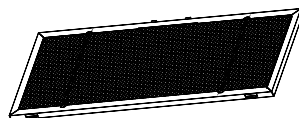
- 1) Remove the grease filter by pushing down the latch. This will disengage the filter from the hood. Tilt the filter lift out and remove.
- 2) Wash the filters, taking care not to bend them. Allow them to dry before replacing.
- 3) When replacing the filter, make sure that the latch is visible from the outside.

Charcoal filter

- Put the charcoal filter on the back of the grease filter.
- Use the two metal wires as shown below to insert to the installation hole on the grease filter to fix it.

Lighting

! WARNING

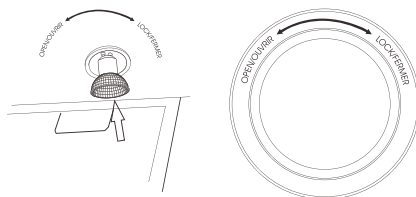
Always switch off the electrical supply before carrying out any operation on the appliance.

! CAUTION

The surface of the LED lamps may be hot. Take care when doing the replacement. This range hood requires two LED lamps.

To change:

- 1) Switch off power and wait for 5 minutes until the bulbs cool down.
- 2) Wear gloves and remove the bulb by twisting in the direction indicated.



**WARNING**

Failure to maintain basic standards of care and cleaning of the range hood will increase the risk of fire.

The range hood should be cleaned regularly internally and externally to preserve its appearance and performance.

DO

- Clean the range hood periodically with hot, soapy water and a clean cotton cloth.
- Always clean in the same direction as the grain.
- Always rinse well with clean water two or three times after cleaning. Wipe completely dry with a soft, non-abrasive cloth.
- After cleaning, you may polish with a non-abrasive stainless steel polish or cleaner. Always rub lightly and with the grain.
- Ensure that the venting system is free of debris, if you have one.

DO NOT

- Do not use corrosive or abrasive detergents, or any products containing chloride, fluoride, iodide, or bromide on this product, as they will deteriorate the surface rapidly.
- Do not allow cleaning compounds, salt solutions, disinfectants, or bleaches to remain in contact with the product for extended periods of time.
- Do not allow deposits to remain for long periods of time on the range hood. Rinse with water immediately and wipe dry with a clean cloth.
- Do not leave the range hood dirty for long periods of time or allow dirt to accumulate.
- Do not let plaster dust or any other construction residue enter the hood. During construction or renovation, cover the hood.
- Combustible products used for cleaning, such as acetone, alcohol, ether, or benzyl, are highly explosive and should never be used close to a range or stove.

Troubleshooting



WARNING

Turn off the power circuit breaker or the power switch on the junction box before installing or servicing this unit. Touching circuitry inside the range hood while it is energized will result in death or serious injury.

Problem	Solution
The range hood will not operate.	▪ Check that the power supply cable and all electrical wiring are properly connected. ▪ Check that the power is turned on at the junction box or circuit breaker. ▪ Check that the wiring between the switch board and the control board are connected properly.
The range hood vibrates when the fan is opening.	▪ Check that the range hood has been secured properly to the wall or cabinet. Tighten it into position, if necessary. ▪ Check that the motor is secured in place, if not, then tighten the motor in place. ▪ Check that whether the fan is damaged. If yes, replace the fan.
The fan seem weak.	▪ Check that the duct size used is at least 152mm/6inch. The range hood will not function efficiently with insufficient duct size. ▪ Check that the duct is not clogged with debris and the tight mesh on the wall cap, if applicable, isn't restricting air flow. ▪ Check that the damper unit is opening properly, if applicable.
The lights work, but the fan is not spinning, is stuck, or is rattling.	▪ Check that the fan isn't jammed or scraping the bottom. ▪ If nothing else works, the motor may be defective or seized. If so, replace the motor.
The range hood is not venting properly.	▪ Check that the distance between the cook top and the bottom of the range hood is 760mm/30inch. ▪ Check that duct work follows all requirements. Use metal duct work with a uniform diameter 155mm/6.1inch. Reduce the length of duct work and the number of elbows if necessary. Ensure that all joints are properly connected sealed and taped. ▪ Check that the duct does not open against the wind. ▪ Ensure that the power is on high speed for heavy cooking. ▪ Wind from opened windows or doors may affect the performance of the range hood. ▪ Close windows and doors to eliminate outside air flow.
A light does not work.	▪ Check the light bulb to see if it is loose. If so, tighten. ▪ Remove the problem bulb and insert one you know is working. If the properly functioning light does not come on, the problem may be light assembly. ▪ Have the light assembly serviced or replaced.

Your appliance is covered by a one year limited warranty. For one year from your original date of purchase, Electrolux will pay all costs for repairing or replacing any parts of this appliance that prove to be defective in materials or workmanship when such appliance is installed, used and maintained in accordance with the provided instructions.
