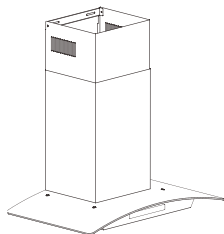

- A 120 volt, 60 Hz., AC only, 15-amp, fused electrical circuit is required.
- If the house has aluminum wiring, follow the procedure below:
 1. Connect a section of solid copper wire to the pigtail leads.
 2. Connect the aluminum wiring to the added section of copper wire using special

connectors and/or tools designed and UL listed for joining copper to aluminum.

Follow the electrical connector manufacturer's recommended procedure. Aluminum/copper connection must conform with local codes and industry accepted wiring practices.

- Wire sizes and connections must conform with the rating of the appliance as specified on the model/serial rating plate.

The model/serial plate is located on the left side of the range hood.

- Wire sizes must conform to the requirements of the National Electrical Code ANSI/NFPA 70 — latest edition*, or CSA Standards C22.1-94, Canadian Electrical Code Part 1 and C22.2 No. 0-M91 - latest edition** and all local codes and ordinances.

If provided with an electrical plug, connect the hood to a receptacle that complies with current regulations and placed in an accessible position. Where an electrical plug is not provided (direct connection to electrical network) or the plug will not be in an accessible position after installation, place an approved bipolar switch in accessible position that provides full disconnection under overvoltage category III conditions, in accordance with local wiring rules.

It is the personal responsibility of the consumer to have the appropriate outlet or junction box with the correct, properly grounded wall receptacle installed by a qualified electrician. It is the responsibility and obligation of the consumer to contact a qualified installer to assure that the electrical installation is adequate and is in conformance with all local codes and ordinances.

Before manually cleaning any part of the appliance, be sure all controls are turned off and the appliance is cool. Cleaning a hot appliance can cause burns.

Always follow the manufacturer's recommended directions for use of kitchen cleaners and aerosols. Be aware that excess residue from cleaners and aerosols may ignite causing damage and injury.

Clean ventilating hoods frequently - Grease should not be allowed to accumulate on hood or filter.

SERVICE AND MAINTENANCE**

Do not repair or replace any part of the appliance unless specifically recommended in the manuals. All other servicing should be done only by a qualified technician. This reduces the risk of personal injury and damage to the appliance.

Always contact your dealer, distributor, service agent, or manufacturer about problems or conditions you do not understand.

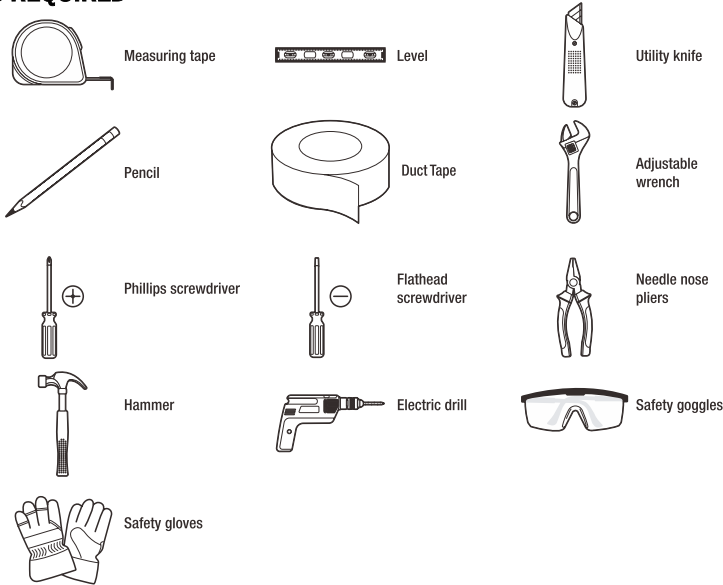
Ask your dealer to recommend a qualified technician and an authorized repair service. Know how to disconnect the power to the appliance at the circuit breaker or fuse box in case of an emergency.

Do not touch a hot light bulb. Doing so could cause the bulb to break. Handle halogen lights (if equipped) with paper towels or soft gloves. Disconnect the appliance or shut off the power to the appliance before removing and replacing the bulb.

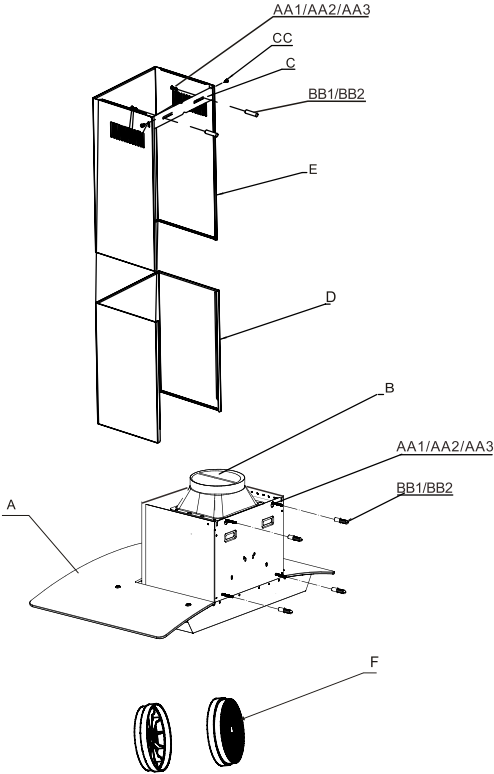

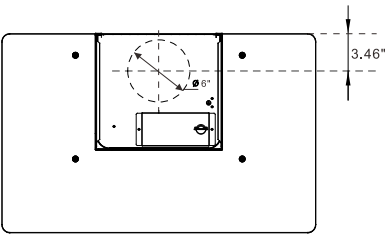

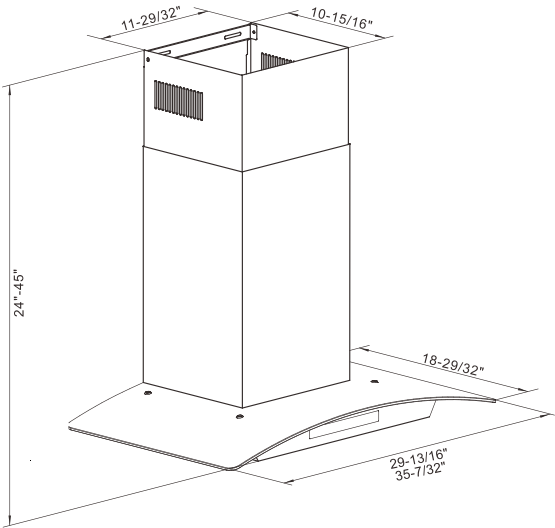

Duct & Wiring location



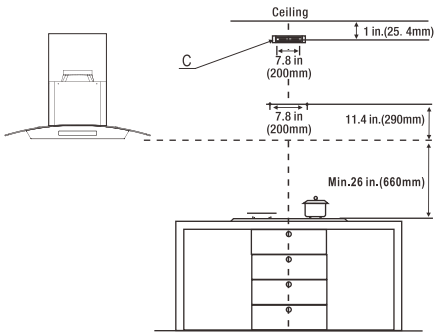
Wiring should enter the back wall at least 20" above the bottom of the hood at height install and be contained within the flue covers.
It is best if the wiring is located offset to the right of center to avoid interference with ducting

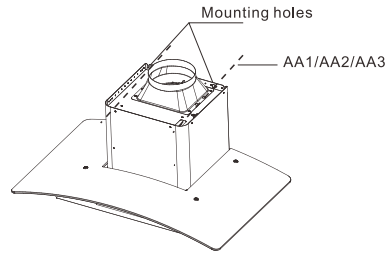
1 INSTALLATION DRILLING AND LINING

1. Draw a vertical line on the supporting wall up to the ceiling, or as high as practical, at the center of the area in which the hood will be installed.
2. Draw a horizontal line at minimum 26 in. above the cooking surface.
3. Place chimney mounting bracket (C) on the wall as shown about 1 in. from the ceiling or upper limit aligning the center (notch) with the vertical reference line.



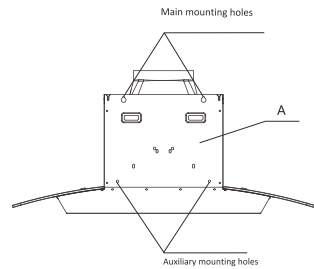
2 MOUNTING THE HOOD

1. Mount the two hood body mounting screws with drywall anchors into the wall along the line that is 11.4 in. above the horizontal line. Ensure the screws and anchors are parallel with the horizontal line. Do not tighten screws all the way. Screws heads must be proud to hang the hood.



2. Hook the hood body (A) onto the screws mounted onto the wall and securely tighten the screws to secure it to the wall. Install two additional hood body mounting screws into the auxiliary mounting holes through the inside of the hood.

3. Mounting holes to secure the hood body (A) in place.



3 DUCT FIXING

CAUTION: To reduce the risk of fire, metal ductwork is preferred.

- Attach an adequate length of ϕ 6 in. round duct on the top the outlet adapter.
- Check and properly tape all joints on duct work to ensure proper connections with duct tape.

4 ELECTRICAL CONNECTION

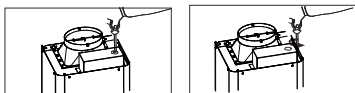
WARNING

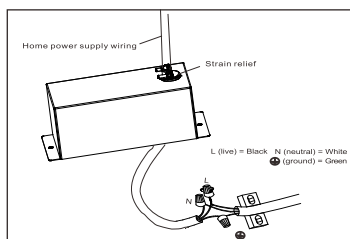
Disconnect power before servicing.
Replace all parts and panels before operating.

Failure to do so can result in death or electrical shock.

- Remove the strain relief hole cover in the junction box and remove the junction box by releasing short screws.



- Install UL/CSA approval strain relief to the junction box and run home power supply wiring through strain relief into the junction box.
- Use UL listed wire connectors and connect white wires(N) together.
- Use UL listed wire connectors and connect black wires(L) together.
- Use UL listed wire connectors and connect bare ground wire from power supply to green ground wire.



- Tighten the strain relief screws and mount the junction box on the range hood using 2 short screws.



WARNING

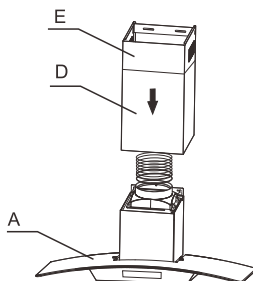
Electrically ground the blower. Use copper wire.

Connect ground wire to green ground screw in terminal box. Failure to do so can result in death, fire or electrical shock.

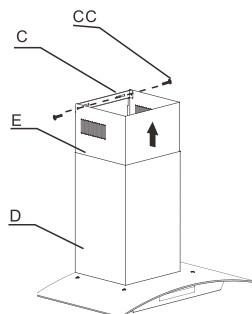
Electrical wiring must be done by a qualified person(s) in accordance with all applicable codes and standards.

5 TELESCOPIC CHIMNEY ASSEMBLY

- Chimney Bottom: Carefully slide the chimney bottom (D) down outside the chimney top (E) partly, and then carefully place the chimney bottom (D) into the recessed area of the hood body (A) top.



- Chimney Top: Ensure the chimney mounting bracket (C) is securely attached to the wall. Raise the chimney top (E) up inside the chimney bottom (D). Secure the chimney top (E) to the chimney mounting bracket (C) with chimney mounting bracket screws (CC) from two sides.



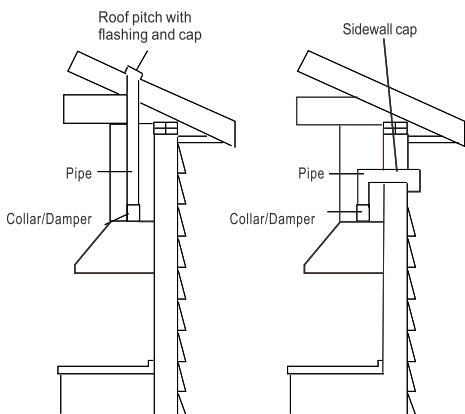
6 EXHAUST CONNECTIONS

DUCTED MODE



CAUTION: To reduce the risk of fire, metal ductwork required.

- For safety reasons when ducting outdoors (not using a recirculation kit), Ducting must vent directly outdoors (not into an attic, underneath the house, into the garage or into any enclosed space).
- Keep duct runs as short and straight as possible.
- Duct fitting (elbows and transitions) reduce air flow efficiency.
- Back to back elbow and "S" turns give very poor delivery and are not recommended.
- Use a suitable 6" round duct.
- Flex metal ducts are not recommended.



Makeup Air

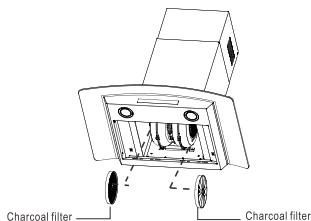
Local building codes may require the use of makeup air systems when using ventilation systems greater than specified CFM of air movement. The specified CFM varies from locale to locale. Consult your HVAC professional for specific requirements in your area.

NON-DUCTED MODE

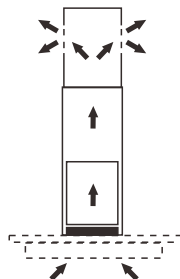


CAUTION: Do not use plastic or rigid metal ducting.

1. Install the charcoal filters on the center post of the blower motor.



2. Please note that the air will flow out from the two grids on the two sides of the chimney top.



Complete Installation

1. Replace grease filter if removed. See the "Range Hood Care" section.
2. Check the operation of the range hood fan and light. See "Range Hood Use" section. If range hood does not operate, check to see whether a circuit breaker has tripped or a household fuse has blown. Disconnect power and check wiring connections.

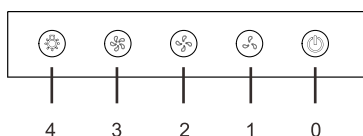

1 OPERATION OF CONTROLS

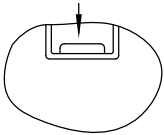
1. The hood is operated using the push buttons on the front panel.
2. The light switch (4) turns the lamps on and off.
3. The blower switch (1,2,3) turns the blower on to three speed settings:
 - 0 - OFF
 - 1 - LOW SPEED
 - 2 - MEDIUM SPEED
 - 3 - HIGH SPEED
 - 4 - LIGHT
4. The power button does not turn on the blower. It only turns off the blower after a fan speed selection is made using buttons 1, 2, or 3.



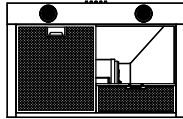
ALUMINUM GREASE FILTER

- The grease filters should be cleaned frequently (every two months of operation, or more frequently for heavy use). Use a warm detergent solution.
- Grease filters are washable. (For dishwasher, top rack only.)

(1) PUSH IN



(2) LIFT OUT



1. Remove the grease filters one by one by pushing in each latch. This will disengage the filter from the hood. Tilt the filter downward and remove.
2. Wash the filters, taking care not to bend them. Allow them to be dry before refitting.
3. When refitting the filters, make sure that the latch is visible from the outside.
4. To install the grease filter, align rear filter tabs with slots in the hood. Push down the latch, push filter into position and release. Make sure the filter is securely engaged after assembly.

NON-DUCTED RECIRCULATION CHARCOAL FILTER

Do not use in ducted installation.

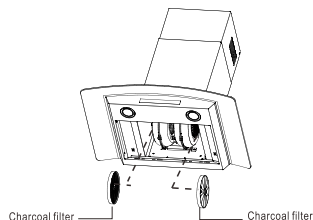
- This charcoal filter is not washable, cannot be regenerated, and should be replaced approximately every 3 months of operation, or more frequently in the case of heavy usage.

1. Remove the grease filters.
2. The charcoal filters must be applied to the suction unit inside the hood, center them inside of the blower motor and turning them 90 degrees until they lock into place.
3. Put the grease filters back in place.



LIGHTING



WARNING: Always switch off the electrical supply before carrying out any operation on the appliance.

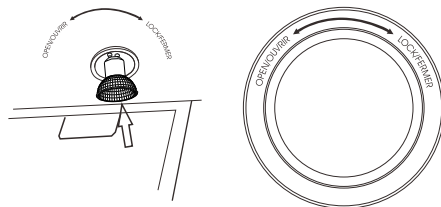


CAUTION: The surface of the LED lamps may be hot. Take care when doing the replacement.

- This range hood requires two LED lamps (120V, GU10, 5W).
- To change LED lamps:
 1. Switch off power and wait for 5 minutes until the bulbs cool down.
 2. Wear gloves and remove bulb as follows

- Place your hands so that your fingers are on top of the hood and center both thumbs on the bulb lens.
- Use both thumbs to rotate the bulb counter-clockwise 1/2 turn.
- Use cautions the bulb will drop freely.
- Carefully remove and reinstall replacement bulb in reverse.

The range hood should be cleaned regularly internally and externally to preserve its appearance and performance.

Do

- ☐ Clean the range hood periodically with hot, soapy water and a clean cotton cloth.
- ☐ Always clean in the direction of metal grain.
- ☐ Always rinse well with clean water two or three times after cleaning. Wipe completely dry with a soft, micro fiber cloth.
- ☐ After cleaning, you may polish with a non-abrasive stainless steel polish or cleaner. Always rub lightly and with the grain.
- ☐ Ensure that the venting system is free of debris, if you have one.

Do Not

- ☐ Do not use corrosive or abrasive detergents, or any products containing chloride, fluoride, iodide, or bromide on this product, as they will deteriorate the surface rapidly.
- ☐ Do not allow cleaning compounds, salt solutions, disinfectants, or bleaches to remain in contact with the product for extended periods of time.
- ☐ Do not allow deposits to remain for long periods of time on the range hood. Rinse with water immediately and wipe dry with a clean cloth.
- ☐ Do not leave the range hood dirty for long periods of time or allow dirt to accumulate.
- ☐ Do not let plaster dust or any other construction residue enter the hood. During construction or renovation, cover the hood.
- ☐ Combustible products used for cleaning, such as acetone, alcohol, ether, or benzyl, are highly explosive and should never be used close to a range or stove .

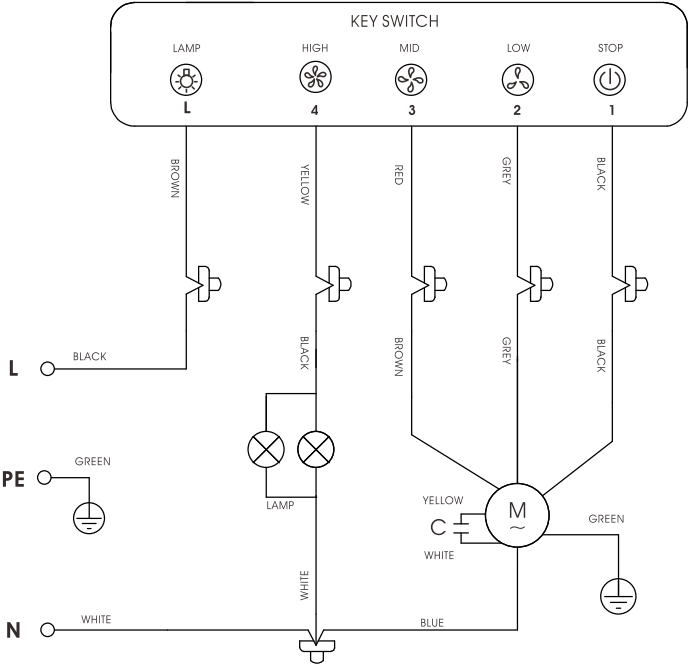

The range hood will not operate.	□ Check that the power supply cable and all electrical wiring are properly connected. □ Check that the power is turned on at the junction box or circuit breaker. □ Check that the wiring between the switch board and the control board are connected properly.
The range hood vibrates when the fan is operating.	□ Check that the range hood has been secured properly to the wall or cabinet. Tighten it into position, if necessary. □ Check that the motor is secured in place. If not, then tighten the motor in place. □ Check that the fan is not damaged. If so, replace the fan.
The fans seem weak.	□ Check that the duct size used is at least 152 mm (6 in.). The range hood will not function efficiently with insufficient duct size. □ Check that the duct is not clogged with debris and the tight mesh on the wall cap, if applicable, isn't restricting air flow. □ Check that the damper unit is opening properly, if applicable.
The lights work, but the fan is not spinning, is stuck, or is rattling.	□ The lights work, but the fan is not spinning, is stuck, or is rattling. □ Check that the fan isn't jammed or scraping the bottom. □ If nothing else works, the motor may be defective or seized. If so, replace the motor.
The range hood is not venting properly.	□ Check that the distance between the cook top and the bottom of the range hood is min. at 26 in. □ Check that duct work follows all requirements. Use metal duct work with a uniform diameter of 150 mm (6 in.). Reduce the length of duct work and the number of elbows if necessary. Ensure that all joints are properly connected, sealed, and taped. □ Check that the duct does not open against the wind. □ Ensure that the power is on high speed for heavy cooking. □ Wind from opened windows or doors may affect the performance of the range hood. Close windows and doors to eliminate outside air flow.
A light does not work.	□ Check the light bulb to see if it is loose. If so, tighten. □ Remove the problem bulb and insert one you know is working. If the properly functioning light does not come on, the problem may be the light assembly. Have the light assembly serviced or replaced.
